**Subject:** The subject is mainly a general idea or topic of your analysis essay. The original text can be a novel, short story, poem, or any other literary document. You need to identify the subject of the text and how it depicts the author's point of view.

**Occasion:** The occasion means the publishing place, time, and era of the text. The occasion also represents the text's connection to an event and when and where it took place. What details of the event have been provided and how the place and time are affecting the context of the text. In other words, identify if it is a critique, a memory, a description, or an argument.

**Audience:** It is important to identify the audience of the text to whom it is directed. How does the author identify the audience? Is it written for an intended or actual audience? The audience can be a person, a small or a large group of people. For instance, some stories are written for youngsters, therefore, these stories must be free of any disturbing elements.

**Purpose:** You will also have to understand the purpose of the text. What message does the author want to convey to the audience? Identification of the purpose will help you to build up your arguments logically.

**Speaker:** Identify the person who is telling the story. It can be the author him/herself, written in a third-person point of view, or a character of the story. Make sure to not confuse the gender of the speaker and the author. Similarly, do not mix up the author's viewpoint with that of the speaker.

**Tone:** The words and sentence structure help in imparting the original and intended meaning of the text. Dissect the words to evaluate the tone of the author. Whether the words are conveying angry, happy, sad, or pleasant emotions. Determine how different elements such as the character, settings, or imagery are establishing a particular tone.

### **Analyzing the key elements**

A rhetorical analysis essay is not just about expressing your own opinion about the text. It needs students to understand all the elements and then select an arguable aspect of the text.

### **Make a strong thesis statement**

An analysis essay demands from you to develop a strong standpoint. Once you have selected an arguable factor in the text, build a strong thesis statement. This is an important step as it will help you to build your arguments around it. The thesis statement must not be more than two to three sentences.
